

Agalychnis callidryas

Red-Eyed Tree Frog

Distribution: Nicaragua, Costa Rica, and Panama

Habitat: Tree dweller that is often found 25' or higher in the canopy of the rainforest, mainly in areas where water collects under the trees.

Size: 2" - 3"

Trade availability: Common



Captive Care

Space: A 20 gallon high or 18x18x18 Exo Terra is suitable for 2-3 adults.

Substrate: Peat sphagnum (2-3" depth) with an inch of pea gravel (or similar) underneath for drainage.

Plants: Live, dense plants such as pothos, philodendron, and monstera (large leaves are best) as well as branches for climbing.

Water: A large, shallow water dish with distilled water is recommended for soaking. Mist the enclosure daily to keep humidity high.

Temperature: Day temperatures no higher than 84°F
Night temperatures around 70-72°F

Humidity: 80% covered, 20% ventilated is recommended. Glass, plexiglass, or Saran Wrap on a screen lid works well.

Lighting: 2% UVB for 10-12 hours a day is required for frogs 2 months and older, no more than 3% UVB. UVB is essential for the frog's growth! It will also help eliminate excess bacteria growth in the tank.

Food: Juveniles: ¼" crickets
Adults: ½" - 5/8" crickets and similarly sized roaches

Dust all food with a 3:1 ratio of Rep-Cal Herptivite to Rep-Cal Calcium with Vitamin D3.
